
If you're on board then simply ring the bell and then please stay seated until the bus has stopped.

Cathedral of St John the Baptist

Built between 1882 and 1910 on the former site of the Norwich City Gaol, the second of Norwich's cathedrals is a short walk from the bus stop. along Upper St Giles Street with independent shops and cafes.

> City Hall, Guildhall & Norwich Market

Our stop outside the art deco frontage of Norwich's iconic city hall provides a fabulous view across the famous market, held here for over 900 years. to the castle. Alongside sits the Guildhall dating from the early 15th century which is England's largest and most elaborate provincial medieval city hall and was the centre of city government until 1938.

D Theatre Royal for Chapelfield Gardens

With plenty of space to relax and recline, and magnificent flower beds, Chapelfield Gardens is the perfect green space to escape the bustle of the city. Next door to the Theatre is the beautiful Georgian Assembly House, now home to a boutique hotel and restaurant, famous for its delicious afternoon tea.



Westwick Street or St Andrew's Street for Norwich Lanes

A short stroll along St Margaret's Alley leads to Norwich's famous lanes, with their host of independent shops, pubs, cafes and restaurants. While exploring, why not stroll along to our next stop to get back on the bus.

Norwich Book Bench Trail

Norwich is home to no less than eight beautifully designed book benches. celebratina its UNESCO City of Literature status. Find them all on the map...

Tombland for Norwich Cathedral

Mousehold Heath

Ketts Hill

Taking its name from two Old English words meaning 'open ground', Tombland is the original centre of Norwich prior to the arrival of the Normans in 1066. From here you can wander past the statue of Edith Cavell and through the Erpingham Gate to discover the famous Norman Cathedral, construction of which began in 1096. The historic Cathedral Close is a

haven of peace and tranquility just a few feet from the bustle of the city and is well worth exploring.



The nearest stop to both the former Port of Norwich, located along the Quayside, and Elm Hill - the most complete medieval street in the city. A major fire destroyed almost everything in 1507, but thanks to extensive rebuilding we can now enjoy a beautiful cobbled street with merchants houses, speciality shops and small cafes.

Bishop Bridge for Pulls Ferry

This stop is a great place to hop off and wander along the riverside path to see the famous 15thcentury Pulls Ferry or the Cow Tower, built in 1398 to defend the city from the higher ground to the north-east. From here you can also take a short walk up Ketts Hill, named after the leader of the 1549 Kett's Rebellion, to Kett's Heights from where you can get a splendid view right across the city
